Surfacing Significant Ideas In the Breakout Rooms ...

- In less than 2 minutes, establish a facilitator and timekeeper for your small group.
- One person begins by presenting on idea of personal significance from the reading, why it is significant and/or how it will be applied in their work in the year ahead. Each person has up to seven minutes to discuss which including time additions from group members after the presenter speaks.
- In the last three minutes, the group summarizes what they have learned together and be prepared to share an insight with the larger group.
- 7 minutes per person plus 3 minutes based on the time remaining, group sizes need to be capped at ... in order to ensure that each person has a chance to raise their idea.

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Breakout Room Ground Rules

- Here are some ground rules, written as behaviours and grounded in the communication core competency:
 - In less than 2 minutes, establish a facilitator and timekeeper for your group.
 - Listen respectfully. Do not rehearse what you are planning to say in your head while others are speaking.
 - Help others feel comfortable when sharing their ideas.
 - Be mindful of the Protocol and keep the conversation focused.
 - Share the air and invite silent members into the conversation so that all voices are included.
